

Our Family Story: A Fundraiser and a Family Benefit Event

Fundraiser portion:

Benefit portion:

Awareness portion:

Our family provided the awareness items, printing out FPIES information prior the event, writing our son's story and printing pictures to have in a 'scrapbook', and slide show of pictures. Being that our family was coordinating the Benefit and the Fundraiser part was covered with the food vendor, we were able to focus on these FPIES Awareness items and sharing our story.
